May minutes reviewed and approved.</p> <p>OLD BUSINESS/NEW BUSINESS</p> <p>Pat Zapp reported the states goal is to have over 15 local municipalities pass local ordinances and have statewide smoke free air one of the first items that is addressed in January 09. (Monona, Marshfield, and Eau Claire have passed local ordinances.) Coalitions advised to be educating & identifying supporters for sf statewide bill – outreach activities discussed. In regards to funding, Oneida Co. will see an additional one time funding increase of 5k due to the increase in tobacco control budget. Oneida County has also accepted Forest Co. funding and will be implementing objectives there.</p> <p>Local media and outreach pieces circulated. 101 Things to do in WI, Karen Knudson’s retirement, Michelle Mays National Award, New Intern and work with WI Wins, FACT Student Peer to Peer Education Tour, and Youth and SF Law Boston Study shared. Lakeland Times, News of the North,, radio, and Channel 12 continue to do a great job covering tobacco stories. HPHOC business letter went out to 150 + businesses and 4 businesses called to be added/revised on the entertainment guide. 14,000 guide inserts to go in paper before July 4th. Mr. Fritz Hasler from Three Lakes has volunteered to distribute guides in Three Lakes area at waterski show and businesses. Thank you! Discussion on political candidates and upcoming races. Members discussed “Green Businesses” and oppty to outreach with them. Reviewed evaluation of Women of Influence event.</p> <p>Presentation scheduled for Nicolet Area Tech. YRBS comparison chart distributed and education along with our comprehensive efforts seem to be working. Rates of tobacco use declined for every question. RHS FACT students worked on local activities to compliment the new state FACT campaign, “They killed 8000.” Students did cups in fence, left notes in library, flags in McDonald Square, and spray painted sidewalk downtown with FACT message. They received coverage on Channel 12. Students working on Relay for Life activities June 20th at RHS track.</p> <p>Susanne Morris reported Riverside ‘Fax to Quit’ Program will be up and re-running.
